HCE Scholarship Applications

Children and Grandchildren of HCE members (a member for a minimum of 2 years) are eligible to apply for a scholarship to be awarded at the annual meeting in April, 2018. High school seniors and students currently enrolled in college may apply. An application is available from your unit President, any county board member or from Darlene at the Extension office. Completed applications are due by **March 1, 2018**.

To complete the application the student needs to ask two people for a written reference. Teachers, college professors or advisors and employers that can speak to the student's extracurricular activities, leadership skills and responsibility are excellent sources. They will also need to write a biographical essay, describing their future plans and intended course of study and their accomplishments. Remind the applicant to include any honors, such as National Honor Society membership. A current academic transcript and a wallet size photo will also be required.
