Veterans Day in Adams County

The 10th Annual Veterans' Day parade will be held Saturday, November 4th beginning at 10 AM at 12th and Maine and continuing to 5th and Maine. Over 100 units are expected to participate. The Grand Marshall will be Margaret "Marge" McClain, a WW II US Marine veteran. Marge is the wife of the late Elmo McCain. Four members of American League Post 37, in the specific uniforms of the US Army, Marines and Air Force will lead the parade, followed by a caisson, a rider-less horse. At 1 PM the parade will move to the Illinois Veteran's Home to honor the veterans unable to attend the earlier parade.

The program for Veterans Day at the Illinois Veterans Home will take place at 10:00 a.m. on Saturday, 11 November 2017 in Lippincott Hall. The guest speaker or American Legion Post 37 Color Guard and Honor Guard have not been finalized at the time this issue was finished.

The Quincy Exchange Club's "Field of Honor" will be on display in Madison Park this year. The days and time of display will be announced at a later date. If you have never viewed the display in the past, it is worth the trip down 24th or Maine Street to see the 1,000 American flags on display. Its breath taking and very patriotic.



2018 Scholarships

Family holiday dinners are a great time to share applications for a 2018 Adams Co. HCE Scholarship. Children and Grandchildren of HCE members (a member for a minimum of 2 years) are eligible to apply for a scholarship to be awarded at the annual meeting in April, 2018. High school seniors and students currently enrolled in college may apply. An application is available from your unit President, any county board member or from Darlene at the Extension office. Completed applications are due by **March 1, 2018**.



To complete the application the student needs to ask two people for a written reference. Teachers, college professors or advisors and employers that can speak to the student's extracurricular activities, leadership skills and responsibility are excellent sources. They will also need to write a biographical essay, describing their future plans and intended course of study and their accomplishments. Remind the applicant to include any honors, such as National Honor Society membership. A current academic transcript and a wallet size photo will also be required.

Funds from the Applebee's Pancake Day on **Saturday, February 24, 2018, 8 AM to 10 AM** will help fund our 2018 scholarships. Your help promoting and serving to family and friends continues to make this a successful annual event and helps determine how many scholarships can be awarded. Tickets will be available in December for the next Applebee fundraiser.

KIDDIE BAZAAR is held each year on the first Saturday of the month. Children from Pre-K through 5th Grade are eligible to shop at the KIDDIE BAZAAR. Each child is asked to bring a list of family and friends for whom they wish to buy gifts. All gifts are priced from \$0.50 to \$4.00. HCE members and youth volunteers from Quincy Senior High, Quincy Notre-Dame plus members from the Beta Club, 4 - H and Boy and Girl Scouts help the young children shop the bazaar.



Card Making and Cookbooks




